You are also asked to scan and upload the following original documents (in jpg, gif, or pdf format):

- Your university degree
- Proof of German-language skills (only the most recent certificate)
- Photograph (optional)
- A letter of recommendation from your employer

The letter of recommendation must be from your current employer (at least from your direct boss). Recommendations from private persons, friends or relatives will not be accepted.

The letter of recommendation should include: your first and last name, birth place and birthday (for easy identification), information about the form and length of your cooperation and of course the recommendation itself, which should discuss your personality, strengths and weaknesses, your field of work and opportunities for further development.

In addition, the recommendation should be specifically written for the 2013 Carl Friedrich Goerdeler-Kolleg application and can be written in German or English on official paper with a signature and contact information.

We recommend submitting the letter of recommendation as part of the first application step, but we also allow applicants to wait until they reach the second round.

#### 2. Pre-selection

After reviewing the online applications, the Robert Bosch Stiftung will make the first selections. Chosen applicants must then hand in the letter of recommendation from their employer within two weeks, if it has not already been sent.

### 3. Personal interviews

Once the pre-selection process is completed, a commission will choose up to 40 candidates for personal interviews. Invitations for personal interviews will be sent out by mid-April.

The interviews will take place in mid-May in Berlin, most likely from May 16 to 17, 2013.

- 1. A speech by the Kolleg director Prof. Günter Verheugen and a group discussion, followed by dinner (with all applicants)
- 2. Short presentation of your project outline (alone)
- 3. Conversation about your aims and motivation (in pairs)
