## Students Academic Conference "Common Past and Future: Armenian - Georgian Relations from the Present Perspective"

On September 28, 2015 at 10:00 am Ivane Javakhishvili Tbilisi State University in its 1<sup>st</sup> building auditorium 115 will host a Students' Academic Conference on "Common Past and Future: Armenian - Georgian Relations from the Present Perspective" organized in frames of the Armenian-Georgian Cooperation through Academia and Students' Inclusion project.

The project was initiated by Hazarashen NGO (Yerevan, Armenia) in cooperation with Center for Civilisation and Cultural Studies at Yerevan State University (CCCS, YSU), Ivane Javakhishvili Tbilisi State University (TSU) and Association of Anthropologists of Georgia (AAG) and was supported by the South Caucasus Regional Office of the Heinrich Boell Foundation.
